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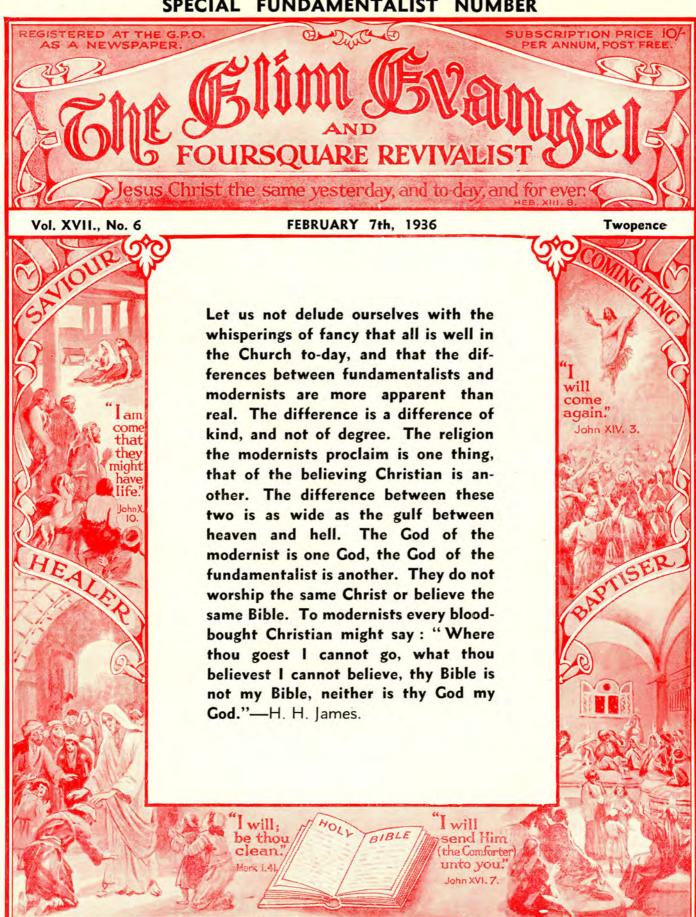

The Foursquare Gospel Movement and Fundamentalism

The Editor

"They spake the Word of God with boldness."

—Acts iv. 31.

THOSE who are conversant with the history of the Foursquare Gospel Movement and have followed its development through the past twenty years will know that it has come to its present position of usefulness and influence amid an unceasing storm of criticism. Again and again it has suffered its baptism of ridicule and reproach; caricatured and condemned it has steadily gone on with its God-given

mission and ministry. Whatever the objections of its critics, methinks all fair-minded observers of the movement will admit that it has rendered no little service to the cause of evangelism and fundamentalism in this country. Its ministry has furnished some of the most striking and convincing proofs of the power of that Evangel which is being discredited and disavowed by much modern biblical criticism. The thousands of transformed lives within its fellowship are an eloquent answer to those who treat the message of the Cross as obsolete and effete. Those great pivotal and cardinal truths of the Christian faith for which all true fundamentalists stand have always found enthusiastic expression in its pulpits and on its platforms. Its mem-

bers may always be discovered in the front rank of those who "earnestly contend for the faith once delivered to the saints." It has established a Bible College the students of which are instructed in those bed-rock truths of evangelical Christianity which mean so much to them in their subsequent ministry, whilst from its Publishing Office flows a constant stream of fundamental teaching in printed form.

We are pursuaded that the greatest ally of funda-

mentalism is revival. It sweeps away that atmosphere of doubt in which modern criticism and its resultant incredulity thrives. It prepares the way for the teaching of those truths which make for solidity and strength of Christian character, bringing man back to the inspired Word with a devout and humble disposition to believe its message and obey its teaching. It restores to the Church those glorious spiritual experiences which serve as the most illuminating commentary on and confir-

illuminating commentary on and confirmation of the Written Word. And this Foursquare Gospel Movement is the outcome of Holy Ghost outpouring. Through the medium of its campaigns and demonstrations throughout this country men and women who had been swept from their religious moorings have been borne back on the crest of revival to a place of restored faith in God and His inspired and imperishable Word. know of those who were wandering in the wilderness of doubt and despair, who through the insidious influences of modern criticism had lost the faith which once shone on their path and shaped their lives. They were derelict-to-day they are anchored to God's eternal revelation

of Himself in Christ. And all through the agency of this despised Movement.

When asked the secret of the remarkable success of the Foursquare Gospel Movement, one cannot but attribute it very largely to its faithfulness to the fundamentals of the Christian faith. Unflinchingly and unfalteringly it has stood for the whole Word of God when by so doing it had little to gain and much to lose. In a period when the reassuring note of certitude

has disappeared from much religious witness, and the keen edge has been taken off the sword of Christian conviction, the Foursquare Gospel Movement declares and demonstrates its faith in the Book in its entirety. The dominant note in its ministry has been unswerving loyalty to the Bible. And because of this God has been pleased to honour its efforts.

The Bible is a supernatural book, supernaturally inspired, revealing the Christ of the supernatural, producing supernatural results. It is this supernatural aspect of the gospel which is emphasised and expressed in this glorious work in these last days. And yet we are asked by some haughty intellectuals to abandon " a crude and obsolete supernaturalism "; to forswear and forsake our faith in the miraculous power of the Word, and in this way reduce the gospel to the level of a decrepit dogma, possessing merely a traditional authority. We are informed that although the Book contains the Word of God, yet it is an admixture of divine inspiration and human invention, and that it is left to man's reasoning powers to discern and decide which is really authoritative. As a movement we affirm that all the Scriptures are God-breathed, and as such must be the final and

INFALLIBLE AUTHORITY

for Christian doctrine and practice. We give, no not an iota of concession to those who presume to pit their puny mental strength against the mind of God. With the inspired revelation of God in our hands and the blessed Holy Ghost in our hearts we refuse to bow to a lofty scholarship, which can only offer us a basis of speculation upon which to build.

This leads us to observe that the Christian Church if it is to achieve its highest and greatest purpose in this age, must possess a Christ who is essentially divine; a Bible that carries with it the authority of inspiration, and an Atonement which is vicarious and victorious. These splendid truths are not so many theories that require justification, but a living revelation that demands proclamation. The Christian Church should not be apologetic but apostolic in her presentation of the message of the Cross.

Let a Church forsake this attitude of fidelity and devotion to the inspired revelation and she will soon be shorn of her spiritual power and passion. A diluted and devitalised gospel must lack that radiant gladness which characterises Christian experience which is built upon the foundation of the God-breathed Word.

In some religious circles the demand for a restatement of truth has been insistent. A

REVISION OF REVELATION

which it was felt would bring the Christian Church into closer contact with the world, and provide it with a more powerful appeal to those outside its fellowship. But a restatement of truth has meant the sacrifice of that which is the vital life force of the Church. Adaptation is a perilous and costly process when it involves the surrender of the gospel's saving dynamic. Adaptation when applied to religious teaching often means adulteration.

In some quarters the fundamentalist has come to be regarded as a controversialist, and therefore an enemy of religious unity. By others he has been charged with possessing an unhealthy intoleration which hampers progress. Fundamentalism certainly has been responsible for a clearer and sharper line of doctrinal demarcation and definition in Christian circles, yet it also possesses a distinct unifying influence amongst those who really love the Lord. It has drawn together those earnest lovers of truth in a deeper unity and sympathy of heart, in many instances breaking through minor denominational emphases and interests which have kept believers apart. It has led to a great and noble crusade against the blighting influences of an assertive and aggressive modernism.

It is high time that the people of God should be made to realise the true character of modernism. Too often modernism has worn a mask which conceals its real purpose. Sacred, orthodox and familiar evangelical phraseology may be found in the modern ministry to which

AN ENTIRELY NEW CONTENT

has been given. This has misled many unwary souls and brought them into darkness and bondage.

We do not hesitate to say that modernism is the most pernicious and poisonous influence at work in the Christian Church to-day. It paves the way for Unitarianism, Spiritism, Russelism, Buddhism, Theosophy and many other similar delusive doctrines, Modernism invariably means mutilation of the Book. The pulpits should be purged of this pestilence.

Therefore we rejoice that this Foursquare Gospel Movement is enlarging its influence and extending its borders. That its message and ministry contains an effective answer to modern criticism of the Book, and provides a Spirit-filled challenge to all dishonouring departure from God's wondrous revelation of Himself in Christ.

WHERE THE BIBLE WAS BELIEVED

Dr. Moffat tells us of a certain Kaffir, who came to him one day, saying that the New Testament, which the missionary had given him a week before, had spoiled his dog. The man said that his dog had been a very good hunting dog, but that he had torn the Testament to pieces, and eaten it up, and now he was quite spoiled. "Never mind," said Dr. Moffat, "I will give you another Testament." "Oh!" said the man, "it is not that that troubles me, I do not mind

the dog spoiling the book, I could buy another; but the book has spoiled the dog." "How is that?" inquired the missionary; and the Kaffir replied, "The dog will be of no use to me now, because he has eaten the Word of God, and that will make him love his enemies, so that he will be of no good for hunting." The man supposed that not even a dog could receive the New Testament without being sweetened in temper thereby; that is, in truth, what ought to be the case with all who feed upon the gospel of Christ.

The Fundamentalist's Cry—

BACK-BACK-TO THE BIBLE

HE great watchword of the centuries has been "Forward." Politicians, industrialists, educationalists, religionists have all captured this word and used it repeatedly. Forward! Forward!

"Forward be our watchword," says the hymn writer. Yes, but in effect statesmen, business men, educational men, and all kinds of men have said the same. The thought has been at the heart of nations, armies, mass movements, everywhere.

But there is another side to it all. Frequently in order to go forward there has to be a move back. The move back has provided the momentum for the move forward. The athlete steps back in order to spring forward. The arrow is poised back before it whizzes ahead. Great victories have sometimes been obtained by mighty armies because temporarily they were prepared to move back.

The cry of the Church is "forward." Forward in the name of Christ. Forward unto revival. Forward unto the greatest missionary movement of all time.

It is true we desire to go forward—yea, we eagerly yearn to go forward. But there is a prior cry. In it lies the secret of progress. That cry is, "Back to the Bible."

 To get back to the Bible will provide an explanation of the bewildering international movements of to-day.

Where are the nations moving? What is to be the ultimate end of Italy, of Germany, of Russia, of France, of Japan, of England, and so forth?

Let us concentrate on Russia. Is Russia a progressive nation? Have the Five Year Plans of Russia been beneficial? There are those who would like to argue that they have not. Yet hard facts prove that in some ways Russia is far in advance of ten years ago. A paper cutting provides us with startling thoughts. It is headed, "A Nation takes to Parachutes." That nation is Russia. We are told that 2,500 men and women jump together in parachute displays, and the technical schools turn out 1,000 aviation engineers every year. Parachuting has become a national sport. It is used to make young people air-minded. Once a whole orchestra descended together, playing as they came down. Villagers jump from bell towers, the highest points they can find. A boy who can wear in his lapel a badge showing that he has made at least one jump is very attractive to Russian girls. A woman even applied for a divorce, because her husband refused to jump.

Such information as this certainly makes us wonder where Russia is going. One sentence alone is of utmost significance: "The technical schools turn out 1,000 aviation engineers every year." Where will this lead? No doubt Russia is preparing for war. Russia expects war. One is quoted as saying,

"We expect war—a great war. The two most obvious dangers are Japan in the east and Germany in the west. In the early days of the Soviets my country had to fight for its existence against ten other armies. We have not forgotten the lesson—so we are ready now."

Russia has one sixth of the world's population—about 160,000,000. Her leaders are planning a tremendous future for her. Tragically it is a future without God. Russia is seeking to blot out the very name of God. What will be the end of it all?

Only those who study the Bible can have the slightest idea. Read Ezekiel xxxviii. and xxxix. and there the purpose and end of Russia is revealed. Without the Bible the future of Russia would be an enigma. With it the future is plain.

See the difference between a Bible student and one who is ignorant of the Bible. Said the atheist to the Christian, "The more I consider the whole scheme the more I am bewildered. It's the devilish cleverness that upsets me."

- "You have described it," said the Christian.
- "What do you mean?"
- "Why, I think the Devil is at the bottom of the whole business."

He considered, then said, "I do not believe in God. But maybe you are right—maybe you are right."

The Bible student will discover that this is the only explanation of world conditions to-day. God and the Devil are in conflict. Darkness is fighting against light. Apart from the Bible we should be in entire ignorance of this. But through the Word of God we know that the nations of the north and the south, the east and the west are only carrying out a programme which will end in the utter overthrow of every nation which does not honour God in Christ. Therefore if we would understand the mystifying movements revealed in the daily papers we must get back to the Bible. Without the Bible the youths and maidens of our day, as well as the old men and women, are simply sailing on a stormy sea of heart-breaking speculation. Young men! Young women! Get back to the Bible.

 Again, it is only the Bible that can satisfy the individual heart and the collective home.

I came upon this truth very quaintly set forth in an old book I was reading. It said, "In a search through an old library (of course the library was one of sixty-six books—the Bible itself) I came upon an inventory of the furniture and the contents of a Christian house in the first century. Shall I give you a few of the items? The cup of salvation, the robe of righteousness, pure linen clean and white, the water of life, new wine in the cluster, the bread of life, the finest of the wheat, the hidden manna, the white stone, the crown of righteousness, the crown of life, the crown of glory, the fruit of the Spirit, acceptance, adoption,

assurance of faith, assurance of hope, assurance of understanding, joy and peace in believing, everlasting consolation and good hope through grace, charity, meekness, gentleness, temperance, longsuffering, kindness, forbearance, humility, love of the brethren.

Stop, you say, that is enough—enough for one hour, enough for one heart. What, then, will you say when I tell you not of the furniture, but of the tenant of this mansion? He is the high and lofty One! The Father had said, "I will dwell in you, and walk in you," and He did. The Son said, "We will come unto him and make our abode with him," and they came."

This is a figurative but beautiful way of putting it. It shows that the heart and home can be satisfied with the Word of God. It is the Bible, illumined to us by the Holy Ghost, which brings the heart peace, rest, and fulness.

How effectively an illustration from an American Christian writer puts it. He said:

"In the native State of the writer tidings came one morning to an aged Christian of eighty that his son, a most promising young man of twenty-five, had been murdered by a negro in a dense swamp in the neighbourhood; that the youth had lain mortally wounded for three days and nights in the woods, living only a few minutes after his discovery by a hunter. The motive of the murder was a few dollars which the negro had seen in the young man's hand when he was in town.

"The instant the crushing news was given, the old father fell on his knees gasping out, The Book—the Book!"

"The family knew well what he meant, and brought him the Bible. Opening with trembling fingers the volume that had been his stay and comfort ten thousand times, he turned to the fourteenth chapter of John and began reading with a choking voice in the midst of the weeping household, the incomparable words of the Saviour, 'Let not your heart be troubled; ye believe in God, believe also in Me.'

"With every successive sentence his quivering voice grew stronger, when suddenly as he read the words, I will come again and receive you unto Myself; that where I am, there ye may be also,' he uttered a shout of such rapturous, unearthly joy, that every hearer was electrified, and strong, unsaved men standing near the door wept like children."

No heart can fully rest, no home can be complete without the constant use of the Word of God. So for the sake of every individual and for the sake of every home we should take up the Fundamentalist's cry, "Back—back to the Bible."

3. Again, we must get back to the Bible, for only thus do we get the theological basis for going forward.

What happened in the early days of the Church? This—"They continued stedfastly in the apostles' doctrine." Note especially, "The apostles' doctrine." Then see how Jude phrases it, "The faith which was once delivered unto the saints." Then again the Church is declared to be "built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets."

Modernism does not build upon the apostles' doctrine. It criticises and destroys such a foundation.

Modernism subtly says, "Back to Christ." Get back to the teaching of Jesus, never mind the teaching of the apostolic epistles.

The cry, "Back to Christ," is a very attractive one. It is one the Fundamentalist also loves to use. But the Fundamentalist remembers what the Modernist forgets. If we go "Back to Christ" then Christ tells us to "Go forward to the apostles." He made it clear, that after He had gone above, that through the Holy Spirit, a volume of teaching would come into existence which would carry the gospel message to all parts of the world. That message is found in the books of the New Testament. The Bible contains the message once and for all delivered unto the saints. It is not to be added to, it is not to be subtracted from. Back to the Bible. Back to solid theology. Back to the grand old doctrines of cleansing through the Blood, justification through faith, and the witness of the Spirit. Back to salvation, back to the Baptism in the Spirit, back to sanctified living, back to divine healing, back to divine guidance, back to the second coming of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. If the captain of a ship forgets his compass then the only safe thing is to go back and find it. If the explorer forgets his map then the only safe thing is to go back and get it. The Bible is the Church's compass—the Church's map. It is compass and map in one. The cry of the Fundamentalist is get back to your compass -get back to your map-get back to the Bible.

One great preacher had a greater name. His name was Dr. Pentecost. He was Pentecost by name and Pentecost by nature. He was once met by a freethinker who twitted him for putting faith in the Bible, seeing that the authorship of some of its parts was so uncertain and the subject of much debate. "Look here," said the doctor, "who wrote the multiplication table?" "I don't know," confessed the sceptic. "You believe it, and you use it, and yet you don't know who wrote it." This placed the objector in a difficulty, but he tried to wriggle out of it, and said, "Ah, yes, but it works well." "Doubtless," was the immediate reply of the doctor, "and so does the Bible."

Yes, the Bible works well. It works well for the individual, for the home, for the Church, for the nation. It works well in times of perplexity and doubt, in times of sorrow and distress, in times of backsliding and repentance. It works well in the lives of the childten, in the lives of those going down to tottering old age. Yes, it works well for all. It never fails to work well. It does not deceive. It does not mock us. Like the motor car and the aeroplane, the printing press and the intricate machinery of a huge factory it needs understanding. But for those who understand it there is no doubt about the fact that "it works well."

Therefore we may all unashamedly and imperatively take up the Fundamentalist's cry, "Back—back to the Bible." Then we shall discover that such a going back is the true secret of a victorious going forward.

Let me close by giving Dr. Torrey's remarkable testimony. He said,

"I sometimes shout for joy as I read the Word of

God. People read a great many books for pleasure; some read novels for pleasure, some history for pleasure, some philosophy. There is more real pleasure, there is more real, deep, abiding pleasure in studying the Bible than in all the other books put together. If you will first surrender your will to God, and then get down to the real study of the Bible, you will find more joy in it than in all other books. After a hard day's labour, before I go to bed I open my Bible (don't think that is the only time I study my Bible) get down on my knees, and ask God to give me something out of the Bible as I read; and God opens up His purposes of love, and as I read His wonderful promises my tired heart forgets its weariness, and I fairly shout for joy. I never shout in public-I wonder that I don't-but when I am all alone by myself and with my God, and with my Bible, I shout, I cannot help it. The sweetest, purest, highest, holiest,

most amazing joy I know is when I bend over this Book in prayerful study and God gives me new messages. Before my conversion, if ever there was an utter worldling, I was. I loved the dance, the cardtable, the racecourse. I loved pretty much everything a person ought not to love; I had no taste for what I ought to love—the Bible. One night I went to bed no more dreaming of becoming a child of God than of jumping over the moon. I woke up in the middle of the night, and God met me and saved me. I now hate from the depths of my soul the things I used to love. I hate cards, I hate the dance, and I hate the theatre; I know its contaminating influence. I love the gatherings of God's people, I love to hear the Word of God, and I love to preach it."

What the Bible meant to Dr. Torrey it can mean to us. So let us take up the cry, and let us obey the cry, "Back—back to the Bible."

Return of the Lord Jesus Christ." But some would say to him, "That was where the Thessalonians were mistaken. He has not come. That was where Paul was mistaken. Christ has not come, and that was where the Revelation was wrong in stating, 'I come quickly.' He has not come quickly." Well, the speaker replied, he could not go into the whole vast subject in one address, but he could remind them that with the Lord a thousand years was as a day, so that the Lord could still consider it quickly—as though He had been absent only but days. And he would like to illustrate how he knew that the coming was near.

He had heard "The Messiah" with great delight the previous evening. Now if a man had asked him after the performance had proceeded for a couple of hours, how long he thought it would still continue, he would have answered, "About five minutes." "But," the man might have expostulated, "how can that be? It is in full swing, has been going on for two hours and I see no reason why it should not continue for two hours longer. How do you know it will be over in five minutes?" "Then," said Dr. Guiness, "I should have answered him, "Because I have the score. Don't you remember that beautiful solo?" 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T would be impossible in an article such as this to give an adequate idea of Fundamentalist beliefs, or on the other hand to deal with the difficulties and negations of the Modernist school. Much has been written on both sides, and many honest Christians are bewildered by the perplexities arising from this struggle for truth. Those of us who accept the old-fashioned doctrines will naturally ask, "How are we to face the situation?" Some no doubt might feel inclined to reply with dogmatic scorn, "Take no notice of the modern theologian; we can carry on as we have done for years "; but the time has come when it is no longer possible to treat his claims with indifference. An insipid attitude of isolation looks suspiciously like fear, of which the modern generation is very intolerant. I submit right here that we have nothing to dread, and should boldly face the God-dishonouring reports in a reasonable way.

Perhaps some orthodox dogmatists are partly to blame for this unhappy break-away, in holding theories for which no sensible or biblical explanation can be found. Traditional belief without foundation can never stand the test of honest criticism, but will surely pass away: neither have we any right to propagate popular delusions on the ground that we have been nurtured in them from infancy.

The Modernist on the other hand takes an

EXTREMELY UNJUSTIFIABLE COURSE.

He rejects supernatural Christianity on the ground that belief in miracles is "most contrary to custom and experience." Aggressive dissemination of positive truth has given place to a feeble defence against the cold calculations of his more outspoken atheistical friend. At present he stand upon the platform of agnosticism; but the day is already in sight when he will be forced, by the wave of Materialism sweeping across from the continental nations, to abandon this position for one of open infidelity.

Now the first point of conflict between the old and new schools of thought is clearly the question of biblical inspiration. The knife of higher criticism has been active in mutilating the sacred record, until it becomes useless as a guide to eternal things. We are told the Bible only contains the Word of God, and cannot as a book, be relied upon to give infallible instruction. Such an assumption gives a monopoly of salvation to the intelligent, and obstructs the way of life to the uneducated; for only those with sufficient brains to discriminate between inspired and uninspired writing can hope to find the truth. Such belief is degrading to our knowledge of the nature of God. Perhaps the clearest definition of our belief in the inspiration of the Bible might be summed up in the statement issued by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church, in 1893: "The Bible as we now have it in its various translations and revisions when freed from all errors and mistakes of translators, copyists and printers, is the very Word of God, and consequently, wholly without error."

The internal evidence in support of this belief is overwhelming. No other book among the millions published throughout history, can boast the same unique features. Penned

all its parts, and encompasses within its mighty sweep the whole plan of man's salvation. The coordination of part with part illustrates a supreme controlling mind, for such harmony would be impossible to the most brilliant human intellect. The typical aspect of the services and sacrifices of the Old Testament have a precision almost staggering to the imagination. Its standard of truth gives it the hall-mark of infallibility, for unlike other historical records, it does not gloss over the sins of its heroes and merely recount their deeds of prowess. Its plan, numerical values, high standard of teaching, revelation of an eternal theme, uncompromising demands, literary beauty: all support the internal evidence for inspiration.

Added to this internal proof we have many external witnesses, giving a testimony the critics cannot brush lightly aside. Prophecy has been fulfilled, and is attested in the archives of secular history. No man, however clever, could have given any idea of the circumstances connected with such

HISTORIC UPHEAVALS

as the fall of Tyre, the overthrow of Babylon, or the fall of Jerusalem. Yet God's Word declared even to minor details, the manner of their destruction at a time of national prosperity. Then again the spade of the archæologist daily tells the sacred story over again, as the dust of centuries is removed from the Eastern cities of antiquity.

Consider too the forceful evidence of both collective state and individual soul. This book the Bible has been the bulwark of nations, stabilising the community and changing the whole course of world

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history. It has brought about by its precepts the miraculous transformation called conversion. Are they not the indubitable proof of a mighty energy radiating from this wonderful volume?

Much of the criticism levelled against the Bible has been found to arise from etymological ignorance, or a misunderstanding of the actual science connected with the event. Many cases could be quoted to show the folly of modern exegesis, but we must content

first chapter of Genesis. This passage he declares, with its teaching of six creative days, completely blocks the course of geology; the science which claims to trace in the rocks the marks of life backward for

MILLIONS OF YEARS.

But here again the scientist has failed to read the account carefully enough. No suggestion is ever made that the six days of Genesis i. were God's first dealings with the world. An examination of various scriptures soon makes it clear that a considerable time period exists between the first and second verses of this much-disputed chapter. In verse one we have this bold and unmistakable postulate, "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth." It was created for a definite purpose. Isaiah xlv. 18, " For thus saith the Lord that created the heavens; God Himself that created the earth and made it; He created it not in vain [void, or waste], He formed it to be inhabited ": and yet when we come to the second verse of Genesis i, we are startled by the vivid contrast to this verse in Isaiah: "And the earth was without form and void." What can all this mean, but that some terrible cataclysm must have overtaken the earth following its original creation, leaving it a howling waste over which darkness brooded and disorder held universal kingdom. If scientists have millions of years to dispose of, they can be dropped in here, there is plenty of room for them between these first two verses of the Bible.

Another doctrine rejected by Modernists is the story of the creation of man. Evolution is now acclaimed as truth, and fundamentalists who accept the Genesis record are generally considered

irrational and childish; but an examination of facts proves the credibility of modernists to be most amazing. According to their findings, we are no longer to trace our ancestry through Adam to God, but are asked to grovel among the slime of a cooling earth for the primordial protoplasmic germ which brought succeeding generations into existence. An amazing

STRUGGLE FOR SUPREMACY

among the diverse species places man, after millions of years of progress, (note the millions. Recorded history only boasts its 4,000—6,000 years) at the head of this remarkable universe of life. Swallow this proposition whole, and you will be surprised at the ingenious system: but dare to investigate and you will be alarmed at your discoveries. The whole elaborate theory is built up from a few odd-shaped bones, sundry fossils, and the mental meanderings of the world's great guessers. In all fairness to the scientists we must compliment them on the choice of the word hypothesis, it is an honest admission of the weakness of modern scientific speculation. Even scientists themselves are divided upon the question of Evolution or Creation. Professor Huxley has declared, "I am one of those who believe that at present there is no evidence whatever for saying that mankind sprang originally from any more than a single pair." In 1889 Professor Virchow, of Berlin, one of the finest anthropologists of modern times said, " In vain have the links which should bind man to the monkey been sought; not a single one is there to show," and again some ten years later he wrote, "The attempts to find the transition from animal to man have ended in total failure.

THE MIDDLE LINK

has not been found and never will be." Even at this year's British Association meeting the view was expressed by Sir A. Smith Woodward that the links connecting apes with men were most likely to be found in South-Central Asia. They are still looking for this elusive piece of evidence. Dr. Etheridge, fossiologist of the British Museum has said, and we could reiterate his words, "Nine-tenths of the talk of evolutionists is sheer nonsense."

When theologians make such an ambiguous attempt to substitute a flimsy web of supposition in place of the more concrete facts of divine revelation and human experience, under the plea that the Church must keep abreast of the age, we must cross swords. Never will we surrender faith for mental guesswork.

The fall of man is another doctrine repudiated in this hyper-intellectual age, although one can hardly

"We must destroy it, root and branch, but move

- "First, raise doubt. Is the Bible God's Word? Hath God said? If you can persuade your listener that He hath not said, there is no further question—man's will is his law.
- "Second, denounce as a lie! Should anyone believe the Word to be from God, proclaim it harsh, vindictive, jealous, impure, not sanctioned by great minds and scholars of repute.

"Third show the attractiveness, beauty and desirability of that which it denies or condemns.

"Fourth, suggest the delightful, refreshing, and strengthening taste of the forbidden thing.

" Fifth, tell how it will enlarge experience, increase knowledge, and give wisdom.

"Enter every place—palace and cabin, Christian home and heathen hut, the slum and the dwelling of the honoured,

the den of vice and the temple of worship, college and church, pulpit and pew. In all you will find subjects and helpers for my kingdom.

"Use any and every means to blind, tempt or mislead men, from the lowest passion, the most horrible

Why Fundamentalism?

B UILDINGS that are to last require foundations that will last. Fundamentalists believe in foundations: the two words have the same root and meaning. Yet men have always been lured by false or flimsy substitutes for foundations, especially in matters spiritual and eternal, hence Fundamentalism has come forward to witness to the only Foundation that will stand every test.

The nations of to-day are in sore distress because they have turned away from the true foundations of life, salvation, and happiness. "If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?" asked David. Faith in the foundations is being destroyed on every side, and the Fundamentalists are pleading with the Church, the nation, and the world to turn back to the old and only foundation of blessing. "For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ" (I. Cor. iii. 11). False teachings increase, "Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, the Lord knoweth them that are His" (II. Tim. ii. 19). May a great volume of prayer arise from the hearts of the Lord's faithful prayer warriors that may bring the nations back to the place of repentance, confession, prayer, and belief in God's revelation of Himself in Christ.

conceive how people with a modicum of eyesight can fail to see the total depravity of humanity. We are told that man is emerging from the primitive brutal state, and losing the tiger instincts of his more unfortunate ancestry. Speculation such as this may sound well in the classroom, but it falls flat in the street. "Look at the humane influences of civilisation," they declare; "in place of club and tomahawk, man now carries tools and books, and the old barbarity is

RECEDING INTO THE DIM PAST."

But are the facts of life quite as cheerful as this? Let us have the truth! Brutality is still with us; it wears a different garb, that is all! Primitive man killed his tens and perhaps hundreds in a most undignified way. To-day we scatter our thousands into masses of flying flesh with one shell or bomb. We are not so cruel, yet tolerate the manufacture of poison gases to fling our victims writhing into eternity. In olden days it was butchery plus ignorance. To-day it is butchery plus technique. Sin is still the hydra-headed monster, gloating over the death and destruction of the sons of dust; and no amount of philosophy can change its hideous character.

We will glance at two other fundamental beliefs, which have been discarded by the modern religious faculty—the Divinity of Christ, and His work of Atonement. The high standard of John's Gospel and Epistles is denied, and the Lord Jesus Christ is merely represented as a good man who taught wonderful things. But Jesus claimed to be the Son of God, and if that claim be false, He has misled us upon one of the greatest issues of His life. How can we trust the words of a man who told the world's biggest lie? Dr. Joseph Parker wrote these striking words in his book, *Ecce Deus*, "A common man cannot be tolerated after so uncommon a beginning. If he be only a young man of high and most ambitious spirit, he has chosen

A MOST PERILOUS COURSE,

a course which must break down somewhere. It cannot be an easy task hypocritically to represent God upon the earth, without now and again letting the mask slip aside. How can the finite steadily carry the infinite when the infinite is at war with him? Christ

must be more than a good man, or worse than the worst man. If he be not God, he is the Devil." Have we not found these words to be true in the case of modern messiahs? They have found it impossible to support their protestations of divinity through human fallibility. Moreover Jesus challenged the scribes and Pharisees to search the Scriptures in order to prove His Messianic authority. Had there been the slightest discrepancy between His life and the prophetic word, His claims would have been discounted by these shrewd inquisitors, and His bogus pretensions quickly disproved.

The Atonement was the crowning work of His life, and to reject it is to shipwreck our own souls and plunge others to eternal loss. The Cross of Christ has become the centre of the Christian universe. It was esteemed of such high value by those who held conversation with Christ after His resurrection, that we cannot afford to neglect it. Ethical teaching may help to raise the standard of human morality, but only atonement by blood can serve as an eternal remedy for transgression. If there be no efficacy in the sacrifice of Christ, the whole structure of Christianity falls, and the world bitterly awakes to a delusion she has tolerated for centuries. With all its criticisms and claims,

MODERNISM HAS NO PALLIATIVE

for the deep soul-need of mankind. Only by simple trust in the finished work of Calvary can true peace be found.

Modernism then is sadly negative: a mental attitude which has brought about a devastating ecclesiastical death-rot in pulpits all over the world. Its reflexion in the pew is one of the saddest features of this vile incubus, for thousands are resting on its rotten platform, which is destined to fall in the day when God shakes the world for the last time.

Fundamentalism on the other hand is happily positive. Having a definite message of salvation, it still offers the way of life and peace to a bewildered fearful world. May God give us grace to "earnestly contend for the faith once delivered to the saints.

crime to the loftiest encomiums of beauty, virtue, morality, philanthropy. Even speak of Christ Himself as most worthy of admiration and supreme among men, but never, never speak of His sacrificial blood as an atonement for man's sin!

- "Organise methodically, strongly and wisely every principality. Conserve every power. Let all rulers of the darkness of this world redouble their defence and attack unceasingly that crumbling corner in the fortifications of the enemy—'spiritual wickedness in high places.' Put into the mouths of popular teachers arguments that take from, distort, or dissipate the whole meaning of the Word.
- "Destroy, blast, ruin every vestige of faith in that Bible! Thus you will irremediably destroy all faith in Him whose work, life and death are its theme from beginning to end. Misconstrue, tear to shreds, throw aside page after page, till little or nothing is left. Prove that it asserts the opposite of what it evidently says. Many will accept this, though such treatment of a small business document would be treated with contempt.

- "Make a strong point of this argument: The supernatural claims of the book are impossible, even to the Creator and Lawgiver of the universe!
