## THE HOMILIES OF MACARIUS.

THE Bishop of Birmingham writes that the reference to the Old Testament in the phrase: οὕτως γὰρ ὁ νόμος λέγει, ἀνὰ μέσον κρίσεως κρίσις καὶ ἀνὰ μέσον ἀφέσεως ἄφεςις, which he was unable to trace at the time when he wrote his article (vol. viii p. 90) on the *Homilies of Macarius*, is to Deut. xvii 8 ἀναμέσον κρίσις κρίσεως καὶ ἀναμέσον ἀφὴ ἀφῆς—a passage which Macarius both remembers and interprets amiss.
