

List of Tertullian's Works

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These are given in the order in which they appear in the *Corpus Christianorum, Series Latina*, Turnhout, 1954. The arrangement is roughly chronological, in so far as an order can be determined. The fifth book of the *Adversus Marcionem* and subsequent works are generally held to exhibit Montanist influence. English equivalents for the Latin titles are given in brackets, but these do not necessarily correspond to forms actually in use.

English translations of Tertullian's writings are usually to be found as parts of a series, of which the three volumes dedicated to him in the *Anti-Nicene Christian Library* (Edinburgh 1869-70) remain the best known. More recently, the Catholic University of Washington, D.C., has sponsored a new series, *The Fathers of the Church* (New York, 1959-), in which his works also appear. Individual treatises occasionally come out in bilingual editions, the most significant recent contribution being E. F. Evans' edition and translation of the *Adversus Marcionem* (2 vols), Oxford, 1972.

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
